

Whilst at these companies, I have been at the forefront of Building Regulation consultations. A major achievement was helping to keep Positive Input Ventilation in the 2010 revision. This was achieved by working with another manufacturer for the common good of our industry and those who rely on this method of ventilation. Following on from this I was contacted by the German ventilation trade association in connection with developing a BS/EN13141 standard for PIV. I chaired working group 156 for CEN which is the European equivalent of British Standards with 34 member states involved. Diplomacy and negotiation skills were of greater importance than outright technical knowledge.

At this moment in time there is no trade association representing the growing number of residential ventilation specialists. My belief is that it is far better to attract them to engage with the PCA rather than a



potential rival organisation, with different values and beliefs to ours.
